Enclosed is official notice of the upcoming SPSC Annual Meeting of Shareholders, a Proxy Form, and proposed 2015/2016 budget. Ideally you will be able to attend the meeting. However if you cannot attend or wish not to, voting by proxy will allow you to have your voice heard. If you intend to have a Board member vote your proxy be advised it must be returned in the enclosed envelope no latter than May 20, 2015. Please review all enclosed information carefully.

HELP WANTED!

Your current board members have taken the Services Company off to a great start -- but they can't go on forever. Some members of our team are ready to move on, focusing instead on long-postponed travel plans. There will be upcoming vacancies on the board that must be filled if we are to continue delivering the Park services you all expect. If you are a shareholder, please consider becoming a board member for 2015-2016 -- we need your help! Throw your hat in the ring by calling the number above to get on the ballot at the Annual Meeting.

REGARDING THE PROPOSED 2015/2016 BUDGET

As in previous years, the budget for the Services Company is presented in parts: 1) ROADS, 2) ANCILLARY SERVICES, and this year part 3) the BRIDGE (Replacement Project). Again as in the past, the annual bill for Services is computed using only the ROADS portion of the budget divided by the number of properties in the Park.

The revenue that is used to pay for Ancillary Services (Trash, Pine Needles, Common Area Maintenance, and General Administration associated with those items) comes for the most part from Lease Easement payments made to the Services Company by the Water Company.

The funding earmarked for the Footbridge Replacement Project is a two-year \$50/year special line item on all property owners' bills.

SUBJECT TO CHANGE

The budget as proposed herewith is subject to modification between now and the meeting. Here is why that may be the case. As you were informed at last year's annual meeting, the Recreation Association (RA) had, and still does have, pending litigation against property owners who failed to pay or only partially paid the RA for ROADS MAINTENANCE (dating pre-13/14). By general consensus at last year's meeting, the Services Company has held off

initiating a similar lawsuit and incurring the associated legal expense. It is believed the settlement of the yet-pending RA case will establish a precedent on which the Services Company can and will proceed to secure collection from non- or only partially-paying property owners.

Amazing that it has taken this long but it may be that the issues raised by the RA regarding payments for ROADS MAINTENANCE will yet be resolved prior to our Annual Meeting. Additionally as of this mailing, the CPUC's ruling on the Water Company's Application and approval of proposed rates is still pending. The outcome of that could impact the Lease Easement payment amounts the Water Company has paid, and in the future may pay, the Services Company.

The board continues to manage these uncertainties with fiscal prudence, frequent communications with the RA and guidance from our legal counsel. Should anything change between now and the shareholder meeting, we will of course let you all know at that time.
