Dear Ted:

Herb Kearns, President of the above Association, tells me that recently some complaint was made to you or the Board of Supervisors about the signs which the Association placed along the road leading into their subdivision. These signs are to the effect that this property is private property and not open to the public for picnicing or camping.

When the Odd Fellows bought this property, Herb says he inquired of various persons in the vicinity, being old-timers up there, and was told that the County had abandoned this road years ago. Also that no maintenance work had been done on the road by the County for many years.

I wish you would let me know if you can, what the status of this road is. Certainly the Odd Fellows do not want the road to be used generally by the public, and do not want the subdivision property abused by the public.

The Odd Fellows themselves have spent over \$1000.00 improving and maintaining the road for the benefit of their own members.

I will appreciate any information you can give me.
