What Can Sierra Park Residents Do To Promote Park Safety?

This year, the fire danger is extreme! Help protect yourselves, your cabin, Sierra Park, and your neighbors by doing the following:

- Clear up fallen trees, limbs, brush, pine needles on your property as soon as possible. Create defensible space, harden your home, and develop an evacuation plan according to Cal Fire guidelines: https://www.readyforwildfire.org/
- Join FireWise to learn how to make your residence safe in case of fire and to possibly get lower fire insurance rates: https://www.nfpa.org/Public-Education/Fire-causes-and-risks/Wildfire/Firewise-USA
- Register with Tuolumne County's Emergency Notification System at https://www.tuolumnecounty.ca.gov/27/Government. You can receive emergency alerts by email and smart phone.
