We are also investigating the feasibility of a bridge over the creek along with an environmental impact study. We have our parking problems taken care of and will not have cars parked along the road any longer.

We hope the Oddfellows will see the wisdom in working together in harmony rather than settling minor problems between us in the courts and the media.

Please, do not construe this as a threat, for it is far from that. We want to continue being good neighbors and will do all we can to make it happen. We don't feel you have the right to arbitrarily take away the rights we have enjoyed these many years.

We have been your good neighbor and don't think we should be treated like strangers or undesirables. Please be assured that we want to work with you but also understand this is not a situation where only one party can be considered.
