PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Rumors abound, and no matter what position you take on how we should restructure, you can find a rumor to match. However, if you would like the <u>real</u> information on the going forward organization, come to the meeting on April 27th. In short, the OFSRA will transfer all assets within the subdivision(s) boundary (except the Caretaker's cabin) and hold all timberland outside the boundary. Two new corporations have been created. Sierra Park Water Company, Inc. will own the water tanks, wells, pipeline infrastructure and water reserve fund. All property owners will have the opportunity to be shareholders (at no cost) and have all rights afforded "C" Corp. shareholders. Sierra Park Services, Inc. will own all the land, buildings, roads, equipment, bank accounts and reserve funds for buildings, roads and equipment. There is much more detail then what I just described and that is the reason for the meeting. For a number of years, non I.O.O.F. property owners were not allowed to vote for the Board of Directors; they believed they were disenfranchised. The shareholders (I.O.O.F. Property Owners) voted for the Director's, regardless of their fraternal membership. Last year when I returned to the Board, roughly half the director's (including the President) had no affiliation with I.O.O.F. The substance of the issue may be debated, but what is certain; that is all now behind us.

We have a great Park and good services provided at reasonable rates. Even though every property owner has always voted on services and assessments, there is no question our future is what each property owner makes of it. ~Del Wallis

ODD FELLOWS SIERRA RECREATION ASSOCIATION BOARD OF DIRECTORS REGULAR MONTHLY MEETING March 16, 2013

The meeting was called to order at 9:00 AM by President Wallis. Board members present: Velayas, Ordwein, Wallis, Adams, Peter, and Hawke. Board members Cloak and Barrett, excused.

INVOCATION: Given by Director Hawke.

Please note that no recordings of the meeting are allowed.

HOMEOWNERS AND OTHERS PRESENT: Homeowner Mike VanGundy and CSD Ad Hoc Committee members Chris Kiriakou and Heidi Ordwein.

CORRESPONDENCE: Secretary Velayas reported that there was an email from Natalia Mercadal with gate questions. Another email was received from Craig Wend with questions about plans to get internet into the Park. John Steward sent an email regarding the proposed gate on his property. John Wohler requested information regarding rules and regulations and dues in the Park as he is considering purchasing property here. Realtor Paul Wild requested the same information. Yosemite Title Company sent a copy of a Grant Deed for a property which recently changed owners. They also sent a seller's closing statement for the Cedarbrook property. Sierra Nevada Communications sent a map with a proposed right of way for them to install equipment to provide improved internet, phone, and cable services. The County counsel sent an email regarding the forming of the CSD.

MINUTES OF BOARD MEETINGS of February 2013: Velayas moved that the minutes be accepted with no corrections. Director Hawke seconded, motion carried.

CARETAKER'S REPORT: Snow was plowed, roads were sanded, and Rec Hall was maintained along with general maintenance of the Park and the water system. The shop was cleaned and organized. A leaky valve on Deborah was repaired.

DIRECTOR REPORTS

WATER-HAWKE: Director Hawke provided the water report. There were no water line breaks reported since the last BOD meeting of Feb 16, 2013. Mark replaced one leaky Park water valve on Deborah.

Owners are encouraged to keep their phone numbers and addresses up to date by sending changes to the OFSRA BOD at PO Box 116, Long Barn, CA 95335.

And again, Property owners are reminded it is very important to shut off the water supply to their residences! We are not yet clear of potential cold weather.

Water pumped for the month of Feb 2013 was 608,000 gallons.

BUILDINGS-BARRETT: Nothing to report.

ROADS-ADAMS: Director Adams said there was nothing new going on with the roads. Next unit proposed for slurry sealing is from David through Rebecca and including Sarah Circle. The distance is approximately the same as the last unit sealed. Bids will be obtained for the sealing.

EQUIPMENT-PETER: Director Peter had nothing to report.

TIMBER – WALLIS: President Wallis had nothing to report. Preparation of a proposal for the annual meeting will begin.

GATE -- ORDWEIN: Director Ordwein reported that there were no problems and there was about \$270 in gate income for the month. The area around the gate will continue to receive extra sand during

periods of snow removal.

HEALTH AND SAFETY -- ADAMS: Director Adams had nothing to report. Director Peter will be looking in to a way to replace the raft in the pond. The lake will be filled, and bids will be obtained for algae control. Someone vandalized the drain housing on the pond and opened the valve to drain the pond. Caretaker Higgins repaired the damage.

RECREATION: The St Patrick's Day dinner is anticipated to be a good time, and all Directors are looking forward to it.

RECREATION FACILITIES: There is nothing to be done at this time.

FINANCE -- ORDWEIN: Director Ordwein reported that this month's bills amounted to \$5,413.91. Year-to-date \$303,070 has been spent operating the Park since last May. Revenue for the month included approximately \$270 in gate income. Director Peter moved to pay bills; Director Adams seconded the motion, and the motion carried unanimously.

PUBLIC UTILITIES COMMISSION

PLAINTIFFS: Fred Coleman, Ruth Dargitz, Steve Wallace and Larry Vaughn

- **DEFENDANT:** Odd Fellows Sierra Recreation Association, Inc.
- **COMPLAINT:** Odd Fellows Homeowner's Association ("OFSHA") is a non-profit mutual benefit corporation whose Director's are democratically elected by owners of all 281 lots within the Odd Fellows Sierra Park. The water for all the lot owners is supplied by Odd Fellows Sierra Recreation Association ("OFSRA"). The water system is required to be regulated by the CPUC under California Public Utility Code 2701 and 2702, but it is not. OFSRA consists only of Odd Fellows and Rebekah's; OFSRA provides no financial transparency concerning costs it incurs in providing water to lot owners.
- **DISPOSITION:** Status report on settlement efforts and organization as a Community Service District (CSD) due April 15, 2013.

OLD BUSINESS:

President Wallis thanked the members of the Ad Hoc Committee for being present and taking part in the meeting. The sale of the Cedarbrook property closed, and proceeds have been deposited.

NEW BUSINESS:

A meeting will be arranged with the County to discuss formation of the CSD.

THE NEXT REGULAR OFSRA BOARD MEETING WILL BE APRIL 13, 2013

Committee Meeting between OFSRA and the CSD Ad Hoc was convened at 10:11 am.

There being no further business, President Wallis adjourned the meeting at 11:55 A.M.
