October 23 -1956

Meeting called to order by Gene Bianchi at his home in Oakdale California at 7.50 P.M. The roll ~~call~~ of Directors called and absentees noted. Those present were Bianchi, Boydston, Nichols, Gibson, Escobar, Hosmer and Rhien. Absent Hodgson and Buck. The minutes of September² were read and approved as read. Communications were read and disposed of as read. A letter from Geo Ackley, our attorney as sent to brother Neil regarding a communication received from the State Franchise Board stating that the forms sent out by them did not reach them in time to claim exemption and after some discussion, it was moved seconded and carried that the secretary pay the tax when it is sent in by the state and that the letter be turned over to brother Gibson to consult with brother Neil and try and straighten the matter out. A letter from Geo Ackley our attorney enclosing an agreement from Arthur Bowman in which he states that he wants to keep all the money for the timber cut and pay only one half the money received from the lot sales. After discussing the matter it was moved seconded and carried unanously that Bianchi notify our attorney that we would enter into no further agreements with Bowman until all the facts of the former agreement signed by him regarding the timber sale as to who made the tally count, how much was paid for the timber etc. the following bills read and ordered paid, Bush, Ackley, And Milich, \$ 352.50 P.G.&.E for electric service 12.09 Oakdale Concrete Pipe Yards for culvert pipe 22.71 Arthur Garrett Salary for September \$240.00 Standard Oil Co. for Gasoline \$55.40 R.C. Rhien secretary, Treasurer 75.00 Envelopes & cards 18.43 U.S. Treasury income tax withheld \$129.80 State unemployment insurance 16.78 Delta Pipe and Supply Co. pipe fittings for the water system, 51.37 total 911.90. The secretary brought up the matter of the water service charge of Bro, Ryan, who purchased the lots of Hodgson and Bacon, and it was agreed that he pay only for one lot, and if he builds on the other lot he must pay for two lots. After some discussion it was agreed that the lake be drained for the winter, and that bids be called for to put the Bull Dozer in working shape such as new spring and attention to the starting motor. Bro Gibson was given permission to pick up some iron junk the proceeds to go to the school kids for a projector. Loren Hosmer and Bob Rhien were appointed a committee to get out a letter to the cabin owners at the park asking them if they would pay \$7.50 each for periodical inspections of the cabins by Arthur Garrett, Reporting any damage he might find so that the owners could be notified. The secretary was to write a letter to Arnold Nelson asking him if he would be interested in Christmas Trees and Cedar timber.

No further business appearing the meeting was closed after a delicious repast by Mrs. Bianchi/
