

The monthly meeting of the Odd Fellows Sierra Recreation Association Board of Directors was called to order at 10:25 A.M. with the following members present; Wm. Greeno, Loren Hosmer, Herman Wood, Wm. McClintock, Arthur Reichenbach and W. C. Patterson.

The minutes of the meeting August 12, 1962 were read and approved as read.

A letter was read from Sister Mayme Snee requesting the Board sell her lot and a like letter was read from Bro. H/ I. Talcott. The Secretary was instructed to answer these letters informing the writers that the Board was not permitted to sell lots for the members, but would post a notice on the Bulletin Board.

COMMITTEE REPORTS: Reichenbach stated that Bro. Zabel's dogs were now chained in the yard and has had no recent trouble from them. Reichenbach also reported that he had been unable to obtain a satisfactory contract with Matoza for the garbage pick-up. He stated that he would contact some other parties in this regard. Herman Wood stated that he had no report on the proposed new road to the dump.

Forest Ranger Brown, the patrolman in this District, asked for permission to speak and requested that the Forest Service be notified of the annual meeting of the membership. He also introduced Rangers Paul Tyson and Glenn Raloff who talked to us regarding the insect infestation that has reached epidemic proportions in the Pine trees in the County. When asked about the cost per acre to participate in an abatement program, he stated that the Federal Forest Service was unable to do anything on private property and suggested that we contact the State Division of Forestry in regards to their program.

NEW BUSINESS: Reichenbach stated that the water tanks were leaking very badly. The spring is getting very low, however he has been able to pump a sufficient amount of water from the well. The tanks are losing the water as fast as the pump can put it in. He was instructed to contact Al. Celini to see about tank repairs. Reichenbach stated th at the trailer situation has not bettered and he was requested to contact the Hiway Patrol to obtain the owners names and addresses. Reichenbach reported that Sunnyvale Lodge had contacted him and stated that they wished to build two showers in the Campground and wished Board approval. The Board is unable to grant approval until plans are submitted but commended Sunnyvale Lodge for their efforts and instructed Reichenbach to work with them in this regard. Reichenbach stated that there were no boundary lines at the Campground and he was instructed to establish these boundaries and mark them.

Bro. Robert Bergland submitted plans for his proposed cabin. It was moved and carried that these plans be approved with the provision that the State Code be complied with.

It was moved and carried that the bills be paid.

The next meeting will be held October 14th at the Park.
