WATER - Smith - Water use: 451,000 gals.; Tank installation deferred until weather improves and the ground dries out.

ROADS - Morrison - Use caution on the bridge and drive to the center because of bad timbers on the sides.

TIMBER - Adams - No report.

Children should not play in the muck at the lake because it is being cleaned out. Burn area will open as soon as conditions permit. It will close June 1st, so start your lot clean-up early this year.
