BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING - FEBRUARY 9, 1997

The Board of Directors meeting was called to order at 9:00 AM by President Edward Smith. All members present.

MINUTES - On motion MSC the minutes of the 1/12/97 meeting were approved as printed.

MEMBERS BEFORE THE BOARD - None

CARETAKERS REPORT - 1. Welded new shoes on snow plow blade. 2. Repair skids, repair crack on old tractor. 3. Lube & oil change on back hoe (these are warranty items). 4. Repair injectors on grader. Rejoined muffler, cleaned motor air filter, checked for leaks. Recommend hour meter to keep track of usage. 5. Cleaned fire house, shop and old corp yard. 6. Put road base down at Mitchell's & Jordan way. 7. Set up service record on equipment. 8. Sheet rock and tape the gate building. It has now had final inspection. 9. Paint restrooms in Rec. Hall. 10. Run phone line into Board Room. 11. Repair roof in Fire House. 12. Rip Rock on Wheeler Road where there was damage due to heavy rain. The caretaker and Board wish to thank Larry Vaughn, Jim Shoemaker and Daryl Clark and a few others for all the volunteer work they put in on these projects. The Board also wishes to commend Randy Tolbert for his work on these projects. In accordance with the recommendation of the caretaker, it was MSC to purchase hour meters for the grader and small tractor in order to keep better records on how much usage they get.

There was some discussion on insurance coverage needed on some of the equipment since it has been moved to the corporation yard garage. It is also necessary to replace the footbridge over the creek.

CORRESPONDENCE - 1. From William E. Zobel - resignation from the Board. Verdina Hague, as the runner-up in the election has been appointed as his replacement and she was present. 2. Lorraine Nicholson suggesting that vacation time should be used or lost, not accumulated. That matter has already come under discussion by the Board. 3. Rebecca Hoffner - change of name.

COMMITTEE REPORTS - WATER - water use was 480,000 gal.

ROADS - Morrison - There is need for some work at the bridge to keep the dirt from washing down.

BUILDINGS - Hawke - A new door and phone line has been installed in the Board room. The computer has been installed in a room that can be locked. Blinds in the Rec Hall need to be replaced. It was decided to put in horizontal venetian blinds.

TIMBER - Hague - Since the director for this is new, there was a general discussion of what has to be done and when it can be done.

RECREATION - Snell - The next event will be the Corned Beef and Cabbage dinner to be held March 8, 1997. The corned beef and cabbage will be furnished by the lodge. Members bring salads, desserts, vegetable, etc. and your own table service.

HEALTH AND SAFETY - Coleman - There was major concern about a loose dog that has been causing neighbors problems. Members of the Board are to contact the owner to see if there can be a solution. There was also the problem with cars parked on the roadway interfering with snow plowing.

FINANCE - Bonner - Bills for the month totaled \$12,330.61 for the Recreation Association. MSC to pay the bills. We still have one who has not paid assessments and we are trying to get it paid up.

OLD BUSINESS - There was some discussion on how the 5 acre parcel lots are to be sold. The Board thinks they should set up some recommendations to be submitted to the general membership in May. We have had several requests to buy the lots.

NEW BUSINESS - None

No further business appearing, the meeting was closed at 10:00 AM. The next meeting will be March 9, 1997 at 9:00 AM.

Following the meeting an executive session was held, which closed at 10:30 PM
