MINUTES OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS ODD FELLOWS SIERRA PARK MAY 3, 1970

The meeting was called to order at 8:20 a.m. by President Tombe.

ROLL CALL: Present: Tombe, Hildebrand, Bogard, Garner, Bell, Harmer, Jackson,
Adams

Absent: Moody (excused absence)

COMMUNICATIONS: A letter was received and read from Lowell R. Clark, insurance broker, regarding the claim of Mrs. Beatrice Bradshaw. The matter has been referred to our insurance carrier.

Letter received from Logan & Densmore, Attorneys regarding deed covering Lot 120, Blk 15, the property of Hugh Grindstaff. The records are being checked and if a deed has never been issued, a deed will be drawn.

Proof of Claim in Bankruptcy proceedings against J.B. Wells is being cancelled; the property is being returned to the Association.

Bids on insurance coverage were received from Kriese, Haack & Kriese, Modesto, Taylor & Clark, Modesto, and Max Elson, Lodi. Garner made motion, S by Harmer, to accept low bid of Kriese, Haack & Kriese, Modesto, for complete insurance coverage, including general liability, auto, fire, and extended coverage on buildings and equipment in amount of \$1170.00 per annum based on 3 years. Motion carried.

HEALTH & SAFETY: Garner brought up the matter of drainage of waste water on one of the lots in the Park and this will be investigated.

RECREATION: Harmer reported on cleaning & filling of lake.

Garner made motion, S by Bell, that a committee be appointed by the Chairman of the Rec. Com. to get 3 bids on supplying draperies for the Rec. Hall. Motion carried.

An objection has been brought to the attention of the Board by a member of the Association to the trailer which has been parked in the campground for 6 months. Garner made motion, S by Harmer, that Frank Munoz be advised to remove his trailer & equipment from the campground within 30 days to conform with the regulations of the Park. Motion carried.

ROADS: Jackson reported on road conditions. Sierra Materials is to be advised that blacktopping adjacent to the Rec Hall and maintenance building is unsatisfactory and we expect the necessary corrections to be made.

WATER: In the absence of Moody, Bell made report on water lines. Because of the unexpected cold weather some of the pipes froze and ruptures & it was necessary to make a number of repairs.

EQUIPMENT: Bell reported on repairs of pickup and other equipment.

BUDGET: Garner made motion, S by Bell, that tentative budget be accepted as presented. Motion carried.

An application for membership received from Allen J. Brown. Garner made motion, S by Bogard that application be accepted. Motion carried.

Election of Officers: Three positions to be filled at the Annual Meeting on May 24, 1970. Two positions are for three-year terms and one position for a two-year term.

Bills were read and approved. Motion by Hildebrand, S by Harmer, that bills be paid. Motion carried.

Motion made to adjourn meeting. Motion carried.

Meeting adjourned at 12:50 p.m.

SPRING IS HERE. SUMMER COMING UP -

Some reminders - We've noted a number of cycles are going into the meadow, down by the lake, & even along the dam. Park rules limit the use of motor vehicles to road areas only. Cutting across or going into the meadow or down by the lake past the parking area, is forbidden. Also you, the Assn. members, voted to limit the operation of any motor vehicle to persons holding a valid driver's license only. California doesn't license persons under 16 and then, only after passing driver's training in school, other wise 18. A good many children much younger than this have been riding lately on Park roads. Why vote in rules, then not enforce them?

Clean those lots - The weather at the Park has been warm lately, so why not plan a weekend to clean burnables away from your cabins & off your lots? Our Park Dump is open for burnable lot cleanings. Take advantage before the Forest Service cites you. They want a 30 ft. clearing around all buildings.

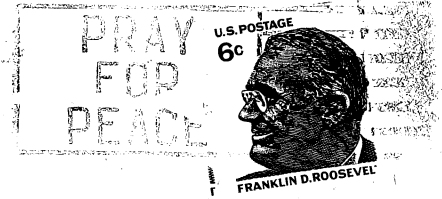
Our meadow has been used in various ways. This list includes the uses in this order: Indians, Potatoes, Logging, and Recreation. Early history says most meadows in the area on both sides of the Ridge were inhabited by Indians in willow & bark villages. When white man came, he burned the villages & killed & drove out its owner as a lesson for stealing horses & mules. The Indians stole them for food, not to ride. Much later a Wheeler family settled & had a potato ranch here. Then in the 40's a lumber mill was built with our lake being part of the mill pond. (old foundations can yet be seen in the center of the meadow below the lake and to the left.) Finally, in 1948, the Odd Fellows bought the property, selling shares to members to pay off the cost. Those members traded their shares for lots when Sub-Division No. 1 came into being. A few of the original investors still have cabins or lots in our Park.
