### Board of Directors Meeting Minutes June II, 2000

The Board of Directors meeting was called to order at 8:30 a.m. by President Del Wallis. Those present were President Del Wallis, Vice President, Robert Snell, Secretary Norrine Coyle, Treasurer Richard Bonner, and members Deena Hague, Raul Morales, Fred Coleman, Ed Smith. Absent was Greg Brown, Unexcused.

The Invocation was given by Richard Bonner.

**MINUTES** - By motion (Hague/Colman, unan.), minutes of the May 14, 2000, meeting were approved as corrected to show that it was the spring instead of Well No. 2 that would be tested and wiring checked.

#### MEMBERS BEFORE THE BOARD - None.

**CORRESPONDENCE** - A donation of \$200 was received from the Ferkeley I.O.O.F #270; a letter from Lorraine and Richard Friedlander concerning removal of some trees in order to facilitate building heir new home on Jordan Way East; communications from the State concerning water matters which were given to the Caretaker.

#### **COMMITTEE REPORTS**

WATER - Morales: Randy reported that 923,300 gallons of water were used during the previous month. Even though many more people were in the park, water usage was down form the l.6 million gallons used in the previous month, which indicates that people found leaks or running water when they came to their cabins. It was pointed out that, in addition to water that was wasted, the Park's bills for pow4er to pump water doubled during the previour month. Randy also said they will soon start putting in new water valuves in Deborah and Rebecca and the water will need to be shut off in those areas while they are doing the work ...

**ROADS - Snell -** He reported that he had been in touch with the people who will be doing the slab under the garbage bin and they still plan to do the work in July . The road sign on Jesse should be in within the next three or four weeks. Will Dorrell, Forester, said they are starting to haul the timber that has been cut. There is still a little cutting to be done. They will start spraying the star thistle in the meadow and the tulees in the lake in a couple of weeks.

**BUILDINGS - Smith -** The caretaker's cabin will be painted next month.

**HEALTH** AND **SAFETY** - **Hague** - The dock will be fixed during the next week. A second portable toilet has been ordered

for the lake area. It was mentioned that people cutting wood need to have spark arresters on their chain saws, a shovel and a fire extinguisher with them..

**RECREATION - Coyle/Snell -** The fishing derby will be held on Saturday, June 17. There will lots of prixes for both the children and the adults. A maximum of 300 tickes will be sold to help pay for the adult prizes. As in the past, immediately following the fishing derby, a picnic will be held after which the prizes will be awarded.

**FINANCE - Bonner -** Total Park bills amounted to \$10,282.05, Timber bills were \$2,832, for a total of \$13,114.05. By motion (Coleman/Smith, Unan.), the bills were approved for payment. The following people have made contributions toward the fishing derby: Roger Townsend, Raul Morales, Ray & Norrine Coyle, Ben Hunter, Bill Williams and Deena Hague. It was agreed that the donation from the Berkeley Lodge would be included in donations for the fishing derby. There were cash donations during the annual meeting of \$29, for a total of \$454. It was mentioned that 34 assessments have been paid so far.

**TIMBER** -Coleman - Then started cutting right after the annual meeting. Homeowners will be allowed to go in and cut slash after the cutting is finished, around July 15. If there is some problem and the lumbering will not be finished by July 15, there will be notice on the marque..

**EQUIPMENT -** Brown (absent) - The seal was reparied on the snow plow and sull service done on the backhoe. Randy expressed his appreciation for the work Ray Coyle and his friend, Bob Hall, did in cleaning up slash and brush at the corner of Jordan Way East and Abraham..

**NEW BUSINESS** - By motion (Coleman/Smith, unan.) The request by the Friedlanders was approved to remove two large pines and two cedars in front of their property, with their paying \$250 to the Park for the wood, and the trees that have been indentified in the back can be taken out, under Randy's supervision, for thinning and safety reasons. There was a discussion of various people in the park who are encroaching on park property with buildings and other property. They will be dealt with individually under the same rules.

The Meeting was adjourned at 10:10 a.m. The next meeting will be on July 9, 2000, at 8:30 a.m..
