BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING - SEPTEMBER 15, 1991

The Board of Directors meeting was called to order at 9:00 AM by President Edward Smith. All members present except Adams, excused.

MINUTES - Minutes of August 11, 1991 B.O.D. meeting read and approved.

CARETAKERS REPORT - Burn area is open. No stumps are to be dumped without seeing Dale first. Two break-ins were reported. Bar ditches need cleaning. Rebecca will need work soon.

CORRESPONDENCE - Letters from: 1. Ed Cole concerning the question of legal quorum at the annual meeting and the \$50.00 equipment assessment. We needed a legal quorum of 80 to conduct business. We had a quorum of 94. Therefore the \$50.00 equipment assessment is due and if not paid will be handled according to delinquent assessment policy. 2. Ray and Billie Michael concerned about excavation behind their lot. 3. Bob Guthrie concerned about old vehicles stored in the park.

MEMBERS BEFORE THE BOARD - Ray Hawkes - Observer.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

WATER - Smith-Pernetti - Water use: 1,900,000 gals. Well #1 is on line. It will produce 18 gal. per minute. This will provide an excellent backup when we need it.

ROADS - Mitchell - Garbage bin is in place and the road is finished.

BUILDINGS - Mitchell - The well house is complete on well #1.

TIMBER - Adams - MSC to have about 40-50 thousand Bd. Ft. of dead and diseased trees harvested.

RECREATION - Greene - The barbecue was a great success. (See the Sierra News letter for details.)

HEALTH AND SAFETY - Clifton - 1. A reminder: Swimming is not recommended in the lake due to stagnant water. 2. Dead trees on private property should be removed before the snow flies.

EQUIPMENT - Harvey - We are still trying to get the snow blower operational.

FINANCE - Zubal - Bills for Homeowners Association: \$34,372.87. Bills for Recreation Association: \$13,866.30. Bills for Timber checking \$567.00. MSC to pay the bills. August income: \$32,790.

OLD BUSINESS - The Ad Hoc Committee, lead by Jim Clifton, is getting started. This committee will review our By-laws to try to streamline the organization.

NEW BUSINESS - 1. MSC to sell the old dump truck for \$3200.00. 2. See Timber.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 10:45PM. The next regular meeting will be held October 13, 1991 at 9:00 AM.

SIERRA PARK NEWS FOR SEPTEMBER 1991

SIERRA PARK LODGE #376 Odd Fellows meetings are held the 2nd & 4th Sat. of each month at 7 PM in the Rec. Hall, except that the meeting will be held at 6:00 PM whenever there is a pot luck scheduled in the Rec. Hall. Pine Tree Lodge held a Three Degree Day on Sunday August 25, 1991. WEATHER-It is hot and dry. However, do be careful of your barbecue fires. Within another month weather will cool and it will be time to think about winterizing cabins. More next month on this.

PINE NEEDLES The quickest way to lose our burn permit is to continue to discard plastics, rubber, roofing materials, stumps, logs bigger than 6" in diameter, etc. We are constantly being monitored by California Department of Forestry and have been cautioned several times. The Burn area is a service provided by the General Membership but we have a few people who constantly abuse it. The burn area is for pine needles and trimmings, not a refuse dump; even leaf bags can not be left in the burn area. Provision for levying fines is already in place.

ANNUAL STEAK BARBECUE - If you didn't make the Annual Labor Day Barbecue you really missed out. If you did, then you know what a great time we all had together. It was a wonderful sight to see all the kids playing and all the adults visiting. It wouldn't have been possible, though, without the generous people who gave their time to make it all happen. REMINDER: - As of September 4, 1991 the garbage bin will be located in the vicinity of the old shop permanently. Also there will be a barricade constructed on the road to the garbage bin. This will require carrying all garbage to put it in the bin - and again, by garbage we mean wet kitchen type garbage. This service has been abused severely in the past and the cost has sky-rocketed. If this service is to continue we must have the cooperation of all of the General Membership. If your place is rented, please see that this information is passed on to your tenants. The road to the garbage will be cleared during snow storms in the winter.
