Invocation by Richard Bonner

By motion (Selman/Townsend, unan.) the minutes of the August meeting were approved as corrected to show "Expenses" for the Timber Fund were "\$1,968.00" and the next meeting is to be September 20.

MEMBERS BEFORE THE BOARD: John Bordes said he wants a copy of the agreement on the Wallace property but his attorney told him he wasn't able to get a copy. Ann Coleman asked for permission to use the lodge hall for a volunteer appreciation dinner in November to thank people who volunteer their time to work in the park. Mike Van Gundy asked about "one-way" road signs during the winter.

Correspondence: 1. A refund of \$13.00 from State Compensation Insurance Fund. 2. A refund from Caldwell Insurance Services for the balance paid for worker's comp. insurance through another company. 3. A certificate of insurance from Poston Logging.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

Water - Selman: 1.3 million gallons were used since the last report. There were no breaks. All samples came back pure and clean. Fire hydrants were tested and when they were closed, a couple had leaks that will need repairs soon.

Roads – Snell: Last Wed., George Reed worked 11 hours at a cost of \$30,000-\$35,000. The work looks good. One person drove on the pavement while the paving was being done. Damages were immediately repaired.

Timber - Coleman: (absent) no report at this time.

Health & Safety – Kasper: The sign has been fixed on Deborah. There was a 46-inch rattlesnake killed by the bridge on E. Jordan. Continue to watch children in all areas of the Park.

Equipment - Brown: (absent) A new battery was purchased for the fire truck.

Recreation – Townsend: He got new utensils that are 21" long for use in the big kettles. He found a new double sink that drains toward the center for \$325. By motion (Selman/Smith, unan) it was agreed to go ahead with the purchase of the new sink. It was agreed to hold the Holiday Dinner on Saturday, December 13^{th} .

Buildings - Smith: The upstairs area of the hall is being remodeled and an air conditioner installed so it will be usable as an office. Also, new windows have been ordered for the lodge hall at a cost of \$976. Sheet rock and wiring for better lighting is still needed in the office. Ed received only one bid out of three requests sent out for repairs in the restrooms to replace pipes, fittings, sinks and toilets. Wray Plumbing bid \$1,350 for the job. By motion (Bonner/Selman, unan) it was agreed to proceed with the work needed in the restrooms.

Finance – Bonner: Bills totaled \$16,540.42. Estimated tax paid from the Timber Fund is \$2,500. By motion (Smith/Selman, unan), bills were approved for payment.

Old Business: Tabled subject of adult fishing before draining lake at end of season was discussed. By motion (Townsend/Smith, unan.) it was agreed that adults would be allowed to fish the lake for one day, Saturday, November 1st.

New Business: The sheriff was called because of a rowdy party and he put a stop to the party. By motion (Smith/Selman, unan), the request to use the lodge hall for a "Volunteer Appreciation Dinner" in November was approved. In response to 1-way roads, it was advised that due to insurance liability we do not make seasonal 1-way roads.

Dear Member:

We need to call your attention to a problem that occasionally occurs in the Park. At times, there is a conflict between Park work and work on private property. Work taking place on Park property, such as paving the roads or repairing a water line, takes priority over work on private property. This is due to the fact that the roads and water system serve all of the property owners in the Park. It should also be noted that the roads belong to the corporation and can be closed for repair, paving, or other needed work. Anyone driving over and damaging the roads when they are closed or freshly paved will be required to pay for any repair resulting from their action.

We try to notify the owners in the Park when the roads are going to be paved or closed for repair. This is not always possible since the company doing the paving schedules us when it is convenient for them. We are a small job and they work us in. If you have a job planned, you should always contact Mike or Gary several days before your work is scheduled. They can tell you if there is going to be a conflict with Park work and you have time to reschedule your job. This also makes us aware of what work is planned in the Park on private property. Park employees can then inform, for example, the company doing the paving of a possible conflict should they call to schedule their job. It would be a shame if you had several trucks scheduled to deliver concrete and they arrived in the Park and could not deliver it because the road they needed to use was closed for paving or other repair. There is always the possibility that an emergency, such as a break to a water line or storm damage to a road, has forced us to close a section of road to make the needed repair. In such a case there is no way we can notify you of a road closure.

Once again, the roads can and will be closed by the Park when necessary for Park business. To save yourself grief and possibly added expense, check with Mike or Gary at least a week before you have a job scheduled for equipment to do work on your property.

We appreciate your understanding and cooperation in this matter.
