Sierra Park Services Company Board of Directors Meeting Minutes for October 12, 2013

Meeting called to order: 10:30 A.M. by Michael Lechner

Invocation given by Ray Coyle

<u>Board Members Present</u>: Heidi Ordwein, Bill Ordwein, Michael Lechner, Yvonne Peter, Ray Coyle, and Wanda Lenhardt.

<u>Approval of September Board Meeting Minutes</u>: Ray Coyle made a motion to approve the minutes from the September 21, 2013 Board of Directors Meeting. Yvonne Peter seconded the motion which was then unanimously approved.

Correspondence:

Email:

An email indicating a change of ownership for a lot was received.

Mail:

A letter was received which complained about the debris found on lots in the Sierra Park. One lot in particular was identified and a photograph of the debris on that lot was provided. A request was made for the Board of Directors to adopt a policy regarding debris on lots.

Director Reports:

Secretary - Wanda Lenhardt: The Sierra Park Services Corporation has sold an additional three shares of stock which brings the total shares sold to 163.

Treasurer Report - Bill Ordwein: The bank account balance was approximately \$126,592 as of October 10, 2013. The bills were reviewed by the Board Members. Bill Ordwein made a motion to pay the bills which come to approximately \$4,405. That motion was seconded by Ray Coyle and passed with a unanimous vote. There are currently 44 outstanding unpaid bills. The loans with interest from the OFSRA have been fully repaid. We are tracking to the budget.

Roads - Heidi Ordwein:

- The contractor, Simunaci, has now been released by the CDF and is in the Park evaluating the roads to be repaired. We should have a schedule from him by next week as to when this is to be done.
- The ditch and culvert cleaning has not been completed. Culverts are still to be done in most of the Park. The Quarterly flushing of the fire hydrants still needs to be done.
- Signage: The two Rebekah signs have now been changed to reflect the correct spelling as per the County records. The other question (by a home owner) spelling of Jonathan was confirmed to be correct and no change was made there. *Thank you Yvonne for looking into this and getting the correct signage*.
- Letters for the sign at the gate (big brown sign) have been ordered. The sign will read "Welcome To Sierra Park".

- Sign at the track leading to the pine needle dump states what is acceptable and what is not for this dump area. Again, thank you Yvonne for following up on this.
- Snow posts: have been placed.

Caretaker Report - Heidi Ordwein: Continuing to work with the Caretaker regarding keeping on schedule as per the Quarterly "To Do" listing. We are headed for an early winter and cannot be behind on having the equipment serviced or the buildings prepared.

Gate - Bill Ordwein: Gate is working fine. Batteries replaced last year should be good until next year. Income \$310.

Equipment - Yvonne Peter: Flat tire on backhoe has been fixed.

Buildings/Common Areas - Yvonne Peter:

- Cleaning of lodge/ floors/ bathrooms/kitchen is scheduled.
- The lodge has been approved for Yoga use November 2, 2013; anyone interested is welcome to come.
- Volleyball net has been taken down and stored till next spring.
- Retaining wall has been put up at edge of basketball court.
- New sign at needle dump installed.
- Signs at dog park installed.

Health & Safety - Yvonne Peter: A plan for draining of lake and buoy removal has been made.

Trees - Ray Coyle: PG&E has not proceeded with their plans to remove trees at this time due to the RIM fire.

Recreation - Michael Lechner: The planning for the Holiday Party was kicked into high gear. Refer to the Holiday Party announcement in this newsletter and details there.
