Meeting Minutes for March 15, 2014

The meeting was called to order at 11:20 by President Michael Lechner.

- One email was received requesting a remote to the gate.
- Three were regarding stock purchasing.
- One property owner provided a telephone number and requested it be connected to the gate.
- An email was received requesting information about payment plans for property owners.
- There were concerns expressed regarding the location of the basketball court and the potential for the balls to end up at the lake.
- One email was received requesting the agenda for this meeting in advance.
- One property owner emailed with concerns about not receiving their stock document and then emailed again saying it arrived.
- One email was received requesting information about how much Sierra Park pays in property taxes.
- A property owner had questions regarding billing.

MINUTES OF BOARD MEETING: Yvonne Peter made a motion to approve the minutes from the February 8, 2014 Sierra Park Services Board of Directors Meeting. Ray Coyle seconded that motion which was then unanimously approved.

DIRECTOR REPORTS:

Secretary - Wanda Lenhardt All of the stocks have been sent to the shareholders. All property owners were notified regarding the need to purchase stock prior to March 28th in order to vote in the May 25th annual meeting. The February Newsletter was also sent out.

Treasurer -Bill Ordwein - The bank account balance at the end of February 2014 was approximately \$96,438. The bills for the month of February were approximately \$7,800. There are approximately forty property owners who have outstanding balances for their 2013/2014 bills. Yvonne Peter made a motion to pay the bills. Heidi Ordwein seconded the motion which was then unanimously approved. We have not paid the Sierra Park Water Company for the services the caretaker has provided so far this year. Bill will take care of paying for these services within the next month. Prior newsletters included a one page financial statement. A second page inadvertently was not included. Wanda will make sure that the second page is included in all subsequent newsletters.

Roads - Heidi Ordwein - Communication with the contractor has been continuing and when he feels the weather will hold he will give us a schedule of work in the Park. This was work that could not be done due to the Rim Fire and weather conditions late Fall 2013. The bids will go out in April for road work to be done in the 2014-15 fiscal year. There have been two employees cleaning out the culverts and ditches. The snow stakes have been put in.

Caretaker's report - Heidi Ordwein - The caretaker has returned to work.

Gate - Bill Ordwein - The gate is in the fixed open position at CalTrans' request. This is being done due to a complaint that was made regarding the gate. The gate will remain open until this matter is resolved.

Equipment - Yvonne Peter - The generator has been moved to the firehouse. It has been tested and is in good working condition. The backhoe repairs have been done.

Buildings/common areas - Yvonne Peter - Installation of the snow stakes has been completed. The flushing of the culverts is 90% complete. PG&E is continuing to top/remove trees as needed in the Park. The corp yard has been cleaned and organized, the gates fixed, and the door repaired.

Health and safety - Yvonne Peter -A dead tree needs to be removed from Park property due to safety concerns .

Recreation - Michael Lechner - The fishing derby permits were filled out and sent to the Department of Fish and Wildlife.

OLD BUSINESS: It is time to review the insurance policy.

NEW BUSINESS:

- The Annual Meeting will be held on May 25, 2014. Preparations for that meeting include beginning a budget committee and securing inspectors for the meeting.
- Friedhelm Peter has been appointed to the board for the remainder of this term.
- The next board meeting will be held on April 12, 2014.

The Board adjourned to Executive Session at 1:39 to discuss legal, personnel, and financial matters.

Executive Session ended at 2:35. There was nothing to report from executive session.

The meeting was adjourned at 12:59
