Dear Loren:

Mr. F. B. Taylor, of Parks Saw Mill, Sonora, tells me he has already talked with you regarding the enclosed permit, which I have drafted, and which he intends presenting to you along with this letter.

I think the terms of the permit are self-explanatory. As I understand it from Mr. Taylor, his company needs this permit to bid on government timber - simply because for a small stretch, the existing logging road for the removal of such timber runs across the land belonging to the Odd Fellows.


Mr. Taylor has a sketch of this property, showing the location of the road, which he will show to you.

As you know, I am not familiar with the physical property, but Taylor says the proposed use of the road will in no way interfere with the plans of the Odd Fellows. No rental is contemplated by Taylor or his company for the desired permit or the use of the road under such permit.

I suppose you will want to present this matter at your next meeting of the Board of Directors. Taylor and his company are anxious to get the permit, if it is O.K. with the Odd Fellows, just as soon as they can.

Of course, as I have explained to Taylor, all I can do under the circumstances, is to draft the permit, and then leave it up to the Odd Fellows to either grant the permit or deny it. I have no personal recommendations in the matter, because I am not familiar enough with it.
